In you, O Father, do we glory,
and in your Son Jesus Christ our Lord:

Through him you have graciously enriched us,
so that we lack no spiritual gift

In the same night that he was betrayed,
he took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, Father, in remembrance of the death of our Lord Jesus Christ, his burial, his resurrection on the third day, and in expectation of his coming again, we offer you through him this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

Grant that, by your Holy Spirit, we who eat this bread, and drink this wine, may be partakers of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Cause us, who share this one bread, to be one in mind, speech, and judgment. Distribute to each member of Christ's body, gracious God, gifts of the Spirit, that we may serve and care for one another. Strengthen us, we pray, by your Spirit, so that we may be blameless in the day of Christ's coming; and grant that, in eating and drinking, and in whatever we do, we may do all things to your glory:

through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.
