Sermon

Creed

The Communion

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise, holy Father, heavenly King, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

For you are the one and only God: through the one Lord Jesus Christ you have made all things; and by the one Holy Spirit you have made us to be one body in Christ

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

In you, O Father, do we glory, and in your Son Jesus Christ our Lord: for through him you have given us all things. You have revealed him to be wisdom for us; our righteousness, sanctification, and redemption. In his name you have washed us, sanctified us, and justified us by your Spirit. Through him you have graciously enriched us, so that we lack no spiritual gift for the strengthening of his body, the church.

In the same night that he was betrayed, he took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, Father,
in remembrance of the death of our Lord Jesus Christ,
his burial, his resurrection on the third day,
and in expectation of his coming again,
we offer you through him this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.
Grant that, by your Holy Spirit,

this bread may be to us the communion of the body of our Lord Jesus Christ, and this cup of wine the communion of his blood.

Cause us, who share this one bread, to be one in mind, speech, and judgment. Distribute among us, who drink of this one cup, the several gifts of the one Spirit, that we may serve and care for one another. Strengthen us, who receive this food, so that we may be blameless in the day of Christ's coming; and grant that, as in eating and drinking, so in all things that we do,

we may glorify you:

through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Prayer after communion

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.
