

Why is the Bible important?

As Christians, we believe that the Bible was inspired by God. This means that we believe that God was speaking to the people who wrote each book, and that each book has something special to say to us.



Getting a picture of God

We can use the Bible to help us understand what God is like. In Psalm 145:8, it tells us that 'The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love'; and even though it may have been written many, many years ago, it tells something important about God. In our own lives we get to know people by seeing how they respond in different situations; and throughout the Bible, we learn more about God through the stories we read.

Jesus gives us the most important picture about what God thinks, feels and wishes to say. We can read about his life, his miracles, his words and his actions in the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

Understanding how God wants us to live

The Bible also teaches people to think about how they should live. It is like a book of rules, with lists of 'dos' and 'don'ts'. The Ten Commandments are probably the most familiar piece of teaching is the Ten Commandments, found in Exodus Chapter 20. Many of these commandments still form the basis of the laws of our country, such as 'Do not steal' and 'Do not murder'.

In the New Testament, Jesus' teaches us to 'Love your neighbour as yourself' (Mark 12:31) and 'Do to others as you would have them do to you' (Luke 6:31). These make as much sense to us today as they did to Jesus' followers 2000 years ago.
