
'Dear Heavenly Father, help us to know you better as we read from the Bible now, and to love Jesus more. Amen.'

Today, we are going to see what the Apostle Paul though was gold dust and what was garbage in comparison!

Read Philippians 3:3, 5-9

I could have confidence in my own effort if anyone could...I am a pure-blooded citizen of Israel and a member of the tribe of Benjamin—a real Hebrew if there ever was one! I was a member of the Pharisees, who demand the strictest obedience to the Jewish law. 6 I was so zealous that I harshly persecuted the church. And as for righteousness, I obeyed the law without fault.

7 I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done. 8 Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ 9 and become one with him. I no longer count on my own righteousness through obeying the law; rather, I become righteous through faith in Christ.

Chat it through

- What did Paul used to think was important? (V5-6)
 - Paul though being very religious, having the best knowledge of the Bible, being from the right background, and following God's laws very closely were the most important things. He thought God would love and accept him because of them.
- But what does Paul now think is the best thing in the world? (v8)
 - Jesus and what he has done. Jesus is on infinite value to Paul. Knowing Jesus is the best thing.
- What does Paul think of the things he used to think important now? (v8)
 - O He treats them as rubbish. Rather than them being gold dust, in comparison to knowing Jesus they are garbage! That is not to say some of the things we treat as precious (family or other things are not important - they are gifts from God. But in comparison to knowing and loving Jesus they are as precious as rubbish.
- Why is Jesus 'gold dust'? (v7-9)
 - Those things which Paul thought were gold dust at one point, and would make God love and accept him, he now realises could never make God love him, or having him back as his freidn. Our sin is too big for us to undo our broken friendship with god just by being good

or religious. But wonderfully Jesus has done that. For the person who truts Jesus he gives them his right stading with God, so we can be loved, forgiven and know him him as friend!

- What things do we tend to think are more precious or important to us? What things do we do which we think will make God like us?
 - There might be lots of different answers reading our Bible, going to church or Thursday
 Service, being good. Or our toys, a nice house or the best clothes...
- Can they do that? Are they as precious as we think? Why/ Why not?
 - They might be good but Jesus is so much better. Only he can make us friends with God again. Only he is really brilliant!

Pray it through

Today we are going to use the word GRACE to help our prayers. It is a Bible word which means God's undeserved kindness. That is what Paul found Jesus had come to bring! That's why he thought Jesus was so brilliant. But it cost Jesus everything. Sometimes the meaning of grace has been described as:

G - od's

R - ighteousness

A - t

C - hrist's

E - xpense

Split your prayers up into Thank you prayers - thanking God for his grace in Jesus, and Asking prayers - try and think of something beginning with each letter you could pray to God about, for example government, researchers, Ansdell...

Craft

Here are two colouring sheets to help us understand the brilliant news Paul found out.

The first one is <u>here</u>. It shows the things we tend to think that will make us right with God again. But they can never do that. They are like mucky clothes in God's sight.

The second sheet is <u>here</u>. Cut these out and cover the mucky clothes with them. This is what Jesus does when we trust him. He covers our wrong over with his goodness which he share with us, so God can see us a perfect in his sight.
